The meeting was called to order. 78 homes were needed to be able to proceed and between attendees and proxies we had enough represented to do so.


It was on the agenda to vote on a change to the CC&Rs regarding basketball goals. However, 67% (267 homes) must vote in favor of the proposed change or it will fail and the current language in the CC&Rs will remain the same. We did not have enough represented, so an alternate solution was determined.

ACC Committee Reminders

Please remember to submit any architectural and/or landscaping changes for approval before starting work.

NOW IS THE TIME TO.....

- 1. Plant Fall flowering bulbs, Fall annuals (Marigolds, celosias & zinnias) and perennials (Sage & Fall Asters). Plant beans and squash early in the month of August: cucumbers, broccoli, cabbage and cauliflower about mid month. Plant leafy crops late in August.
- 2. MULCH, MULCH to keep in moisture and protect against harsh hot temperatures this summer. A good 2" to 3" of mulch is a must in gardens this summer!! Mulch keeps soil moist, roots cool, reduces weeds and, as an added bonus, breaks down as a natural compost into the soil.
- 3. Trees for best results, plant new trees no earlier than October 15.
- 4. Water your lawn and beds at least 1" a week, more is necessary during the hotter days of summer. You can use a tuna can or plastic container on your lawn to measure how much water your yard is getting at one time. DO NOT WATER during the hours of 9am to 7pm. Check your sprinkler heads for proper direction, flow or damage, keep the water on your lawns and not down the drain! Please check the City of Lewisville website for water conservation tools and drought condition status.
- 5. Check out local nurseries on fertilizer tips, or ask your neighbors! It's a good way to get to know your neighborhood!
