READY FOR SUMMER?



Spring is over and summer is here. Now is the time to inspect your property to make sure it can with stand the hot Texas summer.

Some items you might want to check are as follows.

- FENCES: Make sure all fence slats are in good condition, the fence is not leaning, and check to see if the stain needs to be touched up.
- SHRUBS & TREES: Due to extreme winter of 2011, some shrubs and trees might have died. Please ensure all vegetation is alive and well.

- PAINT: Please inspect the exterior of your home, siding, chimneys, front doors, and trim and address any areas in need of repainting or touch up.
- 4. WEEDS: Spring time is the time in which weeds begin to pop up every where. If you see weeds in your yard, please address them quickly so they do not get out of control and take over your yard. There are several products available at home improvement and gardening stores to assist in this endeavor.
- LANDSCAPE BORDERS: If you have landscape borders that are made of brick, stone, metal edging, etc. please inspect them and verify they are free of cracks and damage, are upright and generally aesthetically pleasing.

If you decide to make any changes, upgrades or additions to the outside of your home, please be sure to check the CC&R's (your personal copy or on the website Section 7) and fill out an Architectural Control Form (also on the website) and get approval BEFORE doing so.
